

OUR SCHOOL CODE OF BEHAVIOUR

TREAT ALL OTHERS AS YOU WOULD WANT TO BE TREATED

The standard of discipline set by the school is exceptionally high and is what is acceptable to the school not to individual parents. We have a preventive approach to misbehaviour and expect each learner to have and develop a self-discipline. The purpose is to develop the character of the learner to respect her/his own person and belongings and to respect all other people and their property. And this expectation extends to behaviour outside the school day. However if such self-discipline is not exercised and should any misbehaviour takes place we take very firm action - **the school has a zero tolerance of misbehaviour including noisy, unruly behaviour.** No drug should be brought into the school campus without the school's knowledge and prior approval. All members of the school community must observe policies concerning anti-racism, child protection and children in public care.

Bullying

Bullying is never tolerated at Bishop Milner.

Any form of bullying, any verbal abuse, calling of names and use of bad language, any racial abuse, any harassment and any type of physical violence are completely unacceptable and will not be tolerated and are dealt with by exclusion.

If somebody tries to bully you: Simply say: "Stop it, Go away, Leave me alone" and then you must report the incident to a member of staff.

All bullying incidents must be reported to a member of staff since it is important that all learners feel happy and safe in school. Parents are asked to report any incident of bullying to your child's Head of School. Any child who causes injury or distress through their unacceptable behaviour will be excluded.

Respect Yourself:

Respect Our School Environment:

- eating food and drinking hot drinks are forbidden outside the dining room
- ensure you always leave learning areas in a clean and tidy state and put litter in the bins provided throughout the school
- take care of school property
- take care of displays around the school
- create a calm, happy working atmosphere.

Respect Others:

- be polite and courteous when speaking to others, listening to and respecting their points of view
- be honest and truthful and respect other's property
- walk quietly and keep to the left never shout or chant
- take care at doors and on stairways - wait and do not push through
- be in the right place at the right time
- never bully, either physically or verbally or by any other means whatsoever**
